

Letter from our Interim CEO

Damany Rahn, was appointed as Interim CEO in August 2023 after the sudden passing of Heart Ministry Center CEO, Mark Dahir. Rahn joined Heart Ministry Center as the eighth employee in 2015 as the director of case management and social work. Since then, he has held numerous other leadership roles, including associate executive director, director of strategic partnerships, and most recently, chief human resource officer.

It has been an honor to serve in this capacity. I was elated at our board's unanimous decision to name me the Interim CEO. This shows their commitment to furthering the work we have started. However, it is humbling.

Working at the Heart Ministry Center is personal for me. When I see the faces of the men, women, and children that come into our doors and must meet a need to feed their families, I see me. As a child, I needed access to these services that were not delivered in a dignified way. At the Heart Ministry Center, we pride ourselves on treating everyone well and the constant improvement of services to meet community members' needs together. Our team will continue to carry out our mission of providing food, healthcare and a way forward to people severely affected by poverty in the Omaha area.

When growing up, my family needed assistance to survive, we waited in cheese lines (pantries). I only wish there was a place like the "Heart" when I was a child, as we believe in Dignity for All. This was never my experience growing up. From the first time I entered the Heart Ministry Center doors, I felt it was a place of healing and hope. I personally have grown through that healing. I am inspired and energized every time we graduate a Fresh Start participant or when a Willing Partner realizes a goal that may have eluded them.

Remembering Mark J. Dahir 1974-2023

The Heart Ministry Center community has experienced an immeasurable loss with the sudden passing of our chief executive officer and dear friend, Mark Dahir, on August 3, 2023.

"Mark's raw vulnerability and passion left an indelible impression on everyone in the room, including me," said Rob Wilcox, president of Heart Ministry Center's Board of Directors. "This is a man worth following, I remember thinking. While Mark's tragic passing leaves a deep hole in the heart of the Heart Ministry Center community, his legacy lives on through his gifted team and through the many volunteers and community members he's touched along the way."

Mark lived every day with intention and passion. He embodied Heart Ministry Center's guiding motto, Dignity for All, and the organization's core values: compassion, community, accountability, and excellence.

"There's something about seeing the best in a human being. And we do that at the Heart Ministry Center," said Mark.

"Mark was a friend and a brother," said Damany Rahn, interim chief executive officer at Heart Ministry Center. "There wasn't a thing we didn't discuss. We often talked about God and our faith. We talked about family, my wife and kids, and his daughter. We shared a nonjudgement space with each other that was filled with compassion and accountability. I will miss his one-of-a-kind personality, his passion for life, and his ability to make everyone around him better."

Mark's legacy will live on through the programs he put in place and through all of the people who he has inspired to follow the example he set — to see people from a place of compassion and do whatever is required to help people in need. Mark's was a life well lived. We hope that people everywhere are inspired to live their lives as he did.

Fresh Start Alumna Never Gave Up on Her Future

Crystal Seefus greets everyone with a warm smile and compassionate attitude. As a Fresh Start Facilitator, she enjoys sharing her lived experiences with current Fresh Start participants and those considering the program, and providing information about Heart Ministry Center's campus of resources so others may benefit like she has.

An Omaha native, Seefus experienced abuse and trauma at home growing up. She learned about Heart Ministry Center and the Fresh Start Program when she was in a sober living house, after getting out of jail. She had a job cleaning houses but thought the program was a great opportunity to set herself up for long term success. Crystal interviewed and joined the Fresh Start Program in January 2021. participants to achieve a fresh start in life and be self-sufficient. It encompasses mental and physical health, financial and household management, communication, and job skills. Graduates are placed with a community employer in a position that is suited to their aptitudes and that will balance their household budgets. Ongoing facilitation continues with graduates. More than 120 women and men have graduated from the program.

Seefus graduated from the Fresh Start Program in July 2021 and was hired as a laundromat associate at the Fresh Start Laundromat. She became a valued employee and was eventually promoted to the laundromat manager.

"Fresh Start was a humbling experience," Seefus said. "I learned how to budget. I was never taught how to manage my finances before. I also learned how to set boundaries and to help others without expecting anything in return."

The Fresh Start Program is a holistic, intensive human resource training program empowering

"I tell Fresh Starts that I've been in your shoes. I know how hard it can be. This isn't just a job for me. I truly care," said Seefus.

"Crystal took advantage of everything that Fresh Start had to offer and now has her own car, moved into an apartment and furnished it for her children, and graduated from Douglas County Drug Court, budget, is a fantastic mother to her children again, and is a very valued employee," said Cassandra Schmitz, Fresh Start program director.
